HERE are four varied titles which the Duke recorded between 5th March, 1929, and 12th June, 1930. "Stevedore Stomp" has some excellent rhythm work and a particularly fine open solo by Joe Nanton, "Saratoga Swing", an outstanding example of Duke's ability to play the blues, is one of the most poignant themes that he ever recorded. The further addition of a classically proportioned solo by Cootle Williams, together with solos by Hodges and Bigard, places this in the category of Ellington's masterpieces. From the point of view of musical scoring, however, "The Duke steps out" is the most ambitious track and demonstrates Ellington's tendency, at this time, to contrast rather than to blend his brass and reed sections, "Double Check Stomp" owes its title to an Amos 'n Andy film, "Check and Double Check", in which the Ellington orchestra appeared. Here the powerful swing of the rhythm section is thrown into yet bolder relief by the clipped ensemble phrasing. ALEXIS KORNER
