## DUKE ELLINGTON AND HIS ORCHESTRA 1947-1948

ust prior to the second record ban that kept Duke Ellington and his orchestra out of the studios throughout 1948 and well into 1949, Columbia attempted to produce as much material as possible to see them through the lean period that lay ahead. Although Ellington turned in several new compositions, including the very important "Liberian Suite". he also re-recorded some of his older hits, all included on this CD.

Edward Kennedy "Duke" Ellington was born in Washington, D.C., on April 29, 1899. While still at high school, he began playing in his native city. He soon organized his first little group. "The Duke's Serenaders", including Otto Hardwick and Arthur Whesto), both of whom were to remain with him for many years. Duke Ellington first came to New-York in 1923 with "The Washingtonians", then still led by Elmer Snowden. A year later, the highly ambitious Duke Ellington took over the group and worked with it successfully at the "Kentucky Club" until 1927. The developing band's most successful engagement, at the "Cotton Club", lasted until 1931, when the fledgling Cab Calloway Orchestra took over their spot. Duke Ellington's first tour to England, Scotland and France in 1933 proved an Immense personal and musical triumph. During the thirfies, the Duke and his Orchestra travelled extensively in the United States, and their second visit to Europe six months before the outbreak of war enabled many of their admirers to hear the band in the flesh. Many agree that by 1940 the orchestra had reached its artistic peak. The band's first Camegle Hall concert in January 1943 was followed by innumerable appearances at the world's most famous theatres. Duke Ellington was fortunately able to continue his regular tours around the globe until a short time before his death on May 24, 1974 one month after celebrating his 75th birthday.

This volume of the chronological recordings of Duke Ellington opens with fine vocal versions of "Do Nothin' Till You Hear From Me" (with Ray Nance in the role of Cootie Williams from the original "Concerto For Cootie") and "Don't Get Around Much Anymore" (a.k.a. "Never No Lament"). Al Hibbler's magnificent baritone is prominent on several of the subsequent tracks. Yet, however attractive these versions are, they can never replace the unforgettable recordings of both compositions by Ellington's 1940 big band. Lawrence Brown solos on "A Turquoise Cloud" which he cocomposed with Ellington. It also features a vocal from Kay Davis, followed by Jimmy Hamilton. Artistically, the "Liberian Suite" marks the highlight of this period in Ellington's career as a composer. The work was commissioned by the Liberian government in order to celebrate the centenary of its independence. The impressive prologue, featuring Al Hibbler and Harry Carney, is followed by 5 dances, each of which the Duke modelled around soloists from his band whom there should be no problem in identifying. Al Sears is the final soloist on "Dance No1". Ray Nance plays trumpet on "Dance N°4" and is heard again on the last segment in a musical dialogue with Tyree Glenn before Shorty Baker takes over. Incidentally, the "Liberian Suite" was conceived as an LP issue and indeed was among the very first 10-inch jazz LPs, issued in 1949. On December 30 1947, Ellington and his band recorded another session, including the wonderful "New York City Blues". More than 18 months elapsed before the Duke and his band were finally able to return to the studios. In November 1948, the Duke Ellington Orchestra returned to Carnegie Hall for the seventh time and "The Tattooed Bride" was recorded live then. To be continued...
