his CD documents another important transition in the career of Duke Ellington. Between 1947 and 1953, the planist and his band had recorded for Columbia. These were not the easiest years for the jazz record business – despite the introduction of the LP. Duke Ellington changed over to Capitol records in 1953 and stayed with the label until 1955. The music made during that period has been unduly neglected by critics for various reasons.

label until 1955. The music made during that period has been unduly neglected by critics for various reasons. Edward Kennedy "Duke" Ellington was born in Washington, D.C., on April 29, 1899. While still at high school, he began playing in his native city. He soon organized his first little group, "The Duke's Serenaders", including Otto Hardwick and Arthur Whetsol, both of whom were to remain with him for many years. Duke Ellington first came to New-York in 1923 with "The Washingtonians", then still led by Elmer Snowden. A year later, the highly ambitious Duke Ellington took over the group and worked with it successfully at the "Kentucky Club" until 1927. The developing band's most successful engagement, at the "Cotton Club", lasted until 1931, when the fledgling Cab Calloway Orchestra took over their spot. Duke Ellington's first tour to England, Scotland, Holland and France in 1933 proved an immense personal and musical triumph. During the thirties, the Duke and his Orchestra travelled extensively in the United States, and their second visit to Europe six months before the outbreak of war enabled many of their admirers to hear the band in the flesh, Many agree that by 1940 the orchestra had reached its artistic peak. The band's first Carneglal Loncoret in January 1943 was followed by innumerable appearances at the world's most famous theatres. Duke Ellington was fortunately able to continue his regular tours around the globe until a short time before his death on May 24, 1974 - one month after celebratine his 75th birthday.

Volume 43 of the recordings of Duke Ellington presented in chronological order, opens with two well known extended tracks that have often been reissued. However, the remaining performances from the end of 1952 have rarely been heard for half a century, Jimmy Grissom sounds great on "Ballin' The Blues" but we prefer Betty Roche's impressive vocal on "Body & Soul". Jimmy Hamilton and Paul Gonsalves share solo honors on "Primpin' For The Prom", before Jimmy Grissom returns for two vocals. Ellington and his band recorded a large amount of must for Capitol within a week in April 1953. This blend of old and mostly revamped material alongside new compositions is very varied, both in style and quality. "Sait Doll" prove exquisite with fine solos by Paul Consalves and Ray Nance Duke's version of "Cocktalis For Two" from 1934 (available on Classics 646) is even better. "Stormy Weather", another 'oldie' at the time of the present recording, offers a chance to hear Willie Cook, Ray Nance and Cat Anderson (in that order) on trumpet. Clark Terry, Duke Ellington's fourth and foremost trumpet player of 1953 is featured on "Standust" – one of the most impressive solos he blew as a member of the band. Three more recent compositions follow, including a lovely piano sketch aptly entitled "Blossom". A remarkable remake of "Warm Valley" which originally featured Johnny Hodges (and played Paul Consalves) closes this CD. To be continued...
