The short films included in this compilation are known as Soundies. These musical films were shown in a jukebox machine called a Panoram. Over 2000 of these films were made between 1941 and 1947. Many of the most popular recording artists of the day appeared in them. Initially, Soundies were extremely popular. But due to a shortage of production materials during the war, the Panorams themselves were in short supply. The shortage of Panorams ultimately spelled the demise of the Soundie in 1947. Nevertheless, they captured on film many superb musicians at the peak of their powers making an irreplacable contribution to the history of American music during this period.

The Soundies themselves have had a rocky history. The Soundies Distribution Corp. of America folded. Official Films acquired the rights in the early days of television. Storyville Film, by license from Official Films, has long been the European distributor of the Soundies. But by the time that Storyville began to sell the film, the prints had been spliced up, titles deleted, sections edited out and negatives left to decompose. All the Soundies were originally printed reverse image.

The object of Storyville Films was to locate the best possible print sources and painstakingly restore, as best we can, the Soundies to their original form. This has not been easy. Soundtracks have been cleaned up and resunk up to the best picture. Original titles were restored when possible. The original reverse image has been flipped around.

In some cases, the prints are not up to Storyville's usual excellent standards. But we feel that those titles included of less than excellent quality should be included for their intrinsic musical value.


