


Luckily for everyone, the use of jazz as a powerful emotional propellent has been discovered by the more imaginative producers of motion pictures and television programs, and the results have been gratifying for all concerned, including phonograph devotees. Perhaps the most brilliant of all these scores is the one composed by Duke Ellington for the Otto Preminger production Anatomy of a Murder, the thrilling new film based on the best-selling novel by Robert Traver.

Duke Ellington has long been honored as a genuine "great" in jazz, and his compositions are internationally loved and admired. In composing the music for Anatomy of a Murder, he has drawn upon the full range of his talents to underline the tension and drama of the story, using jazz as an integral part of the whole emotional climate. Where calmer elements in the screenplay come to the fore, the music is smooth and rich, in the mellowest Ellington manner. and when the tension builds, he has used nervous accents to reinforce the feeling.

Anatomy of a Murder boasts not only the Ellington score, but a cast of unusually gifted actors, all of whom give memorable performances. The film was made by Otto Preminger, whose many successes include Porgy and Bess, Carmen Jones, Laura, The Moon Is Blue and The Man With the Golden Arm and many other outstanding successes. It was Mr. Preminger who prevailed upon Mr. Ellington to undertake his first score for a full-length dramatic film. The results of his inspiration are here on this record, as a souvenir of a thrilling movie and as another remarkable Ellington contribution to music.
